FAFSA

To be considered for need-based financial aid, you are required to file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You may file anytime after October 1 of your senior year. The FAFSA is available online at fafsa.ed.gov. The FAFSA code for UMD is **002388**.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Merit scholarships require students to submit a completed application for admission by **December 15** and have all supporting application documents submitted by February 1. To see additional scholarship details, awarding criteria, and scholarship FAQs, visit d.umn.edu/scholarships.

BEST OF CLASS SCHOLARSHIP

Minnesota residents who rank #1 or #2 in their high school class with a 3.9+ GPA can earn up to \$6,000 per year (up to 4 years).

UMD SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students based on the primary and secondary factors used in the admissions process (up to 4 years).

UMD (RAISEME) SCHOLARSHIP

3.2+ core GPA and completed RaiseMe portfolio by December 15. Scholarship award is dependent upon RaiseMe portfolio. (Up to 4 years).

RAISEME

RaiseMe is a free micro-scholarship platform where you can earn money for doing well in classes, visiting colleges, and participating in extra-curricular activities.
